

FIP STARTER KIT

CHECKLIST

A practical checklist to help you prepare before starting FIP treatment.

REMEMBER:

- Contact your vet if you notice any concerning signs
- Track weight and symptoms
- Never skip doses

MONITORING & RECORD KEEPING

- ☐ **Digital pet scale**
For accurate weekly weigh-ins and dose adjustments.
- ☐ **Digital thermometer**
Helps monitor temperature and recovery.
- ☐ **Treatment tracker or log**
Record weight, dose, injection site, appetite, energy and notes each day.
- ☐ **Dosing calculator**
Calculate the correct dose based on your cat's current weight and prescribed dosage.

TABLET TREATMENT SUPPLIES

- ☐ **GS-441524 tablets**
Confirm the tablet strength and prescribed dose for your cat.
- ☐ **Pill cutter**
Helps split tablets accurately when the prescribed dose requires it.
- ☐ **Pill popper**
May make tablet administration easier and less stressful.
- ☐ **Treats**
To make medication time more positive.

INJECTABLE TREATMENT SUPPLIES

- ☐ **GS-441524 vials**
Check the concentration, storage requirements and expiry date.
- ☐ **Injection needles**
22G or 23G needles are recommended. Due to the thick consistency of GS-441524, smaller-gauge needles may make the medication more difficult to administer.
- ☐ **Sharps container**
For safe disposal of used needles and syringes.
- ☐ **Towel or recovery suit**
For gentle restraint when needed.
- ☐ **E-collar**
May help prevent licking of sore injection sites.
- ☐ **3 mL syringes**
For secure preparation and administration.
- ☐ **Draw-up needles**
20G is recommended for drawing medication from the vial.
- ☐ **Cold compress**
May help ease discomfort after injections.
- ☐ **Treats**
For distraction and positive reinforcement.

SUPPLEMENT & SUPPORTIVE-CARE SUPPLIES

- ☐ **Liver supplement**
Recommended to support liver function during treatment.
- ☐ **B-complex**
May be recommended to support nerve health.
- ☐ **Immunomodulator**
May be recommended as supportive care depending on your cat's condition.
- ☐ **Water tablets**
Use only if specifically prescribed; "water tablets" are diuretics and require veterinary monitoring.
- ☐ **Eye drops**
Use only lubricating, antibiotic or other eye drops prescribed by your veterinarian.
- ☐ **Iron supplement**
Use only after bloodwork confirms anaemia and your veterinarian recommends supplementation.

IMPORTANT DISCLAIMER

Supplements and supportive medicines are not substitutes for GS-441524 treatment. Not every cat will need every item listed. Use supplements, diuretics, eye drops, iron products and immunomodulators only with veterinary guidance based on examination, bloodwork and your cat's specific condition. Contact your veterinarian promptly if your cat's symptoms worsen or new concerns appear.
